

TENNESSEE ARTIST Susan Connelly McClelland (b. 1960)

The artist's own words about her life and art make the ideal opening for this article: "I was almost a geologist. When I started at East Carolina University in 1979, I had to make a decision . . . whether to major in something practical where I could make a good living or risk poverty and study the one thing I knew I had a talent and passion for. My heart won out, and I have been a professional artist for over thirty years now. After spending all those years being creative for other people as a professional faux painter, I finally got the chance in 2013 to create art on my own terms." At that turn in her life, McClelland built In Color Studio and switched to art full time, but her love of geology and natural things remained in her heart. "My work is a reflection of all my experiences—the discipline of interior design, techniques of faux painting, and love of the outdoors and geology." She enjoys collecting gems and minerals and observing their details under a magnifying glass, where she can view the "landscapes, layers, and colors of each stone."
