In her home state of Tennessee, her paintings can be seen at several galleries and art shows, including the Fringe Art Group (FRAG) in Kingsport and the Nelson Fine Art Center in Johnson City. Her art was selected by jury for the Jonesborough Fine Art Show, held at the McKinney Center in May 2017, and is currently at the Cindy Saadeh Fine Art Gallery in Kingsport. North Carolina has also hosted her art in various venues: The Warehouse in Hickory, NewZart in Marshall, and the Weaverville Fine Arts Festival in Weaver-

ville. In 2018 she had a solo show at Tusculum College, Tennessee.

McClelland has completed numerous commissions for designers in Sea Grove Beach, Florida, in Berkeley, California, and locally in Tennessee. Her art is currently on display in Virginia at the Weigand Fine Art Gallery in Galax and also at The Birthplace of Country Music Museum in Bristol.
